Food Programs guidelines were obtained by multiplying the current Federal income poverty guidelines by 2, and subtracting \$1.00 and by rounding down to the next whole dollar. Weekly and monthly guidelines were computed by dividing annual income by 52 and 12, respectively, and by rounding down to the next whole dollar.
